OBLATION CEREMONY DETAILS: Let us make this a very special day for those making their first Oblation, others who will make their final Oblation and the many who will be renewing their Oblation. In the spirit of the Gospel, Oblates commit themselves to a continual conversion in Christ. Through the deepening of their baptismal promise, Oblates are free to put on Christ and to allow Christ to permeate their lives. In this way, Oblates come to recognize that in all the phases and events of their lives, in their joys and successes as in their sorrows and disappointments, they are in close union with Christ and participate in his very death and resurrection.

Novices will receive a Benedictine medal and sign a document. New Oblates will receive an Oblate pin, sign a document, receive a Certificate signed by the Prioress and take a new name. Those renewing their Oblation will sign a document. The signed documents will be preserved in the Archives of Sacred Heart Monastery.

Meet Julian of Norwich performed by Molly Delaney, Sunday, November 3, 2002, Bishop Marty Memorial Chapel, Yankton, SD at 1:00 PM. and a Saturday evening workshop at 7:30 p.m. Admission is free!

Julian of Norwich, mystic, spiritual guide and writer, was born in England in 1342, two years after Chaucer, and it is believed that she lived well into her seventies. Her story is a personal account of medieval times when England suffered

from plagues and desperate poverty. She tells of her life as a recluse in Norwich, where she preached a hope-filled message to those in need of spiritual guidance – during a period when faith and hope were easily lost through despair and sickness.

Molly Delaney is a Minneapolis native. She first performed "Julian" in 1986 at the Robsham Theater and has toured the show all over the U.S. for more than ten years.

Molly will give a short lecture on Julian's history, life and works and she will look at quotes from Julian's writings, themes and theology.
