A Word from St. Benedict's Rule

CULTIVATING SILENCE

"Monks should diligently cultivate silence at all times, but especially at night. Accordingly, this will always be the arrangement whether for fast days or for ordinary days. When there are two meals, all the months will sit the together immediately after rising from supper. Someone would read from the *Conferences* or the *Lives* of the Fathers or at any rate something else that will benefit the hearers, but not the Heptateuch or the Book of Kings, because it will not be good for those of weak understanding to hear these writings at that hour; they should be read at other times.

Let me know you, Lord, and let me love you! And you shall be my joy! If I cannot know you fully here, let me go forward daily until the full light dawns. Let my joy be great in expectation until the day when it is wholly mine.

Lord you bid us through your Son to ask of you, and you promise to answer our prayers so that our joy may be full. Meanwhile, let my mind consider and my tongue speak; let my heart love and my mouth proclaim you. Let my soul hunger and my flesh thirst, and my whole being be pierced with desire, until I enter the joy of my Lord.
