## A Word from St. Benedict's Rule

#### **MANIFESTING HUMILITY**

The twelfth step of humility is that a monk always manifests humility in his bearing no less than in his heart, so that it is evident at the Work of God, in the oratory, the monastery or the garden, on a journey or in the field, or anywhere else. Whether he sits, walks or stands, his head must be bowed and his eyes cast down. Judging himself always guilty on account of his sins, he should consider that he is already at the fearful judgment, and constantly say in his heart what the publican in the Gospel said with downcast eyes: *Lord, I am a sinner, not worthy to look up to heaven* (Luke 18:13). And with the Prophet: *I am bowed down and humbled in every way* (Ps 37[38]:7–9; Ps 118 [119]:107).

#### SR. PENNY BINGHAM'S REMARKS AT THE OBLATION CEREMONY

#### **SHORTER CHRISTIAN PRAYER INSTRUCTION**

Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year. Sunday, November 27, 2016, is the first Sunday of Advent. We begin with Evening Prayer I on Saturday night, *Shorter Christian Prayer*, p. 37. At the reading, turn to p. 356. Weekdays in Advent are on pp. 358–376, and are repeated each week during Advent.

On Sundays in Advent, note that the Advent Antiphons are shown in red in the Psalmody. There is a selection of Advent hymns listed on p. 578. If you would like, you can substitute the "O Antiphons" on December 17–23 for the Magnificat antiphon. For Morning Prayer on Christmas Eve Day, turn to p. 378. Christmas Day prayers start on Christmas Eve with Evening Prayer I on p. 380.

During the Christmas Season, for weekdays after Christmas, see pp. 392–395. Continue following the prayers for the Christmas Season until the Feast of the Epiphany.

We wish you a joyous season of preparation as we anticipate the birth of our Savior.

#### THE GREAT "O ANTIPHONS"

The "O Antiphons" refer to the seven Magnificat antiphons recited during Vespers. They cover the special period of Advent preparation known as the Octave before Christmas, Dec 17–23. Each one highlights a title for the Messiah and refers to the prophecy of Isaiah of the coming of the Messiah.

The "O Antiphons" date back to the fourth century. The Latin versions of each of the titles of the Messiah are *Sapientia* (Wisdom), *Adonai* (Lord), *Radix* (Root), *Clavis* (Key), *Oriens* (Dawn), *Rex* (King), and *Emmanuel* (Emmanuel). Take the first letters of each of the titles, starting with the last and working back to the first to spell EROCRAS or "ero cras"—"I will be (there) tomorrow."

The song "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" is created from the seven "O Antiphons." When you sing it, you are joining yourself to a vast throng of Christians, stretching back across centuries and spanning the whole of the earth, who prayed as all Christians do: "Come, Lord Jesus!" (See Rev. 22:20).

The "O Antiphons" may be substituted for the Advent antiphons in *Shorter Christian Prayer* for December 17–23.

# **O** Antiphons

# **Magnificat Antiphons beginning December 17**

- 17 O Sapientia: "O Wisdom, O holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care. Come and show your people the way to salvation."
- **18** *O Adonai*: "O sacred Lord of ancient Israel, who showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him the holy law on Sinai mountain: come, stretch out your mighty hand to set us free."
- **19** *O Radix Jesse:* "O Flower of Jesse's stem, you have been raised up as a sign for all peoples; kings stand silent in your presence; the nations bow down in worship before you. Come, let nothing keep you from coming to our aid."
- **20** O *Clavis David*: "O Key of David, O royal Power of Israel controlling, at your will, the gate of Heaven: Come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death; and lead your captive people into freedom."
- **21** O *Oriens:* "O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come, shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death."
- **22** O *Rex Gentium:* "O King of all the nations, the only joy of every human heart; O Keystone of the mighty arch of man, come and save the creature you fashioned from the dust."
- **23** *O Emmanuel:* "O Emmanuel, king and lawgiver, desire of the nations, Savior of all people, come and set us free, Lord our God."
- **24** Christmas Vigil.
