A Word from St. Benedict's Rule

Brothers, divine Scripture calls to us saying: Whoever exalts himself shall be humbled, and whoever humbles himself shall be exalted (Luke 14:11, 18:14). In saying this, therefore, it shows us that every exaltation is a kind of pride, which the Prophet indicates he has shunned, saying: Lord, my heart is not exalted; my eyes are not lifted up and I have not walked in the ways of the great nor gone after marvels beyond me (Ps 130[131]:1. And why? If I had not a humble spirit, but were exalted instead, then you would treat me like a weaned child on it's mother's lap (Ps 130[131]:2.

A Reflection on God as Love

Love is sufficient of itself, it gives pleasure by itself and because of itself. It is its own merit, its own reward. Love looks for no cause outside itself, no effect beyond itself. Its profit lies in its practice. I love because I love, I love that I may love. Love is a great thing so long as it continually returns to its fountainhead, blows back to its source, always drawing from there the water which constantly replenishes it. Of all the movements, sensations and feelings of the soul, love is the only one in which the creature can respond to the Creator and make some sort of similar return however unequal though it be. For when God loves, all he desires is to be loved in return; the sole purpose of his love is to be loved, in the knowledge that those who love him are made happy by their love of him. The Bridegroom's love, or rather the love which is the Bridegroom, asks in return nothing but faithful love. Le the beloved, then, love in return. Should not a bride love, and above all, Love's bride? Could it be that Love not be loved?


- Fall Oblate Retreat-

Presenter is: Fr. Thomas A. Hillenbrand, O.S.B.

Born in Evansville, IN in 1939 Fr. Tom professed his vows to Benedictine Monastic Life on August 15, 1960 and was ordained a priest on May 27, 1965.

During his many years of monastic life and priesthood, he served the Blue Cloud Community at Marvin, SD as Novice Master, missionary at Resurrection Priory in Coban, Guatemala – a dependent house of Blue Cloud Abbey – and as Abbot. Preceding the assignment to Guatemala, he ministered as chaplain at Sacred Heart Monastery & Mount Marty College in Yankton, SD, and as pastor at St. Michael Indian Mission on the Ft. Totten Indian Reservation in North Dakota. After the closing of Blue Cloud Abbey in Marvin, SD, in 2012, Fr. Tom transferred his stability as a Benedictine monk to Christ the King Priory in Schuyler, NE in 2013.
