Shorter Christian Prayer Instructions

Advent marks the beginning of the Liturgical Year. Sunday, December 3, 2017 is the first Sunday of Advent. We begin with Evening Prayer 1 on Saturday night, page 37. At the Reading turn to page 356. Weekdays in Advent are on pages 358-376, and are repeated each week during Advent.

On Sundays in Advent note that the Advent Antiphons are shown in red in the Psalmody. There are a selection of Advent hymns on page 578. If you would like, you can substitute the "O Antiphons" on December 17-23 for the Magnificat antiphon. On Christmas Eve Day, Morning Prayer, turn to page 378. Christmas Day prayers start on Christmas Eve with Evening Prayer I on page 380.

During the Christmas Season, for weekdays after Christmas, see pages 392-395. Continue following the prayers for the Christmas Season until the Feast of the Epiphany.

Remember you may substitute the O Antiphons for the usual antiphon for the Canticle of Mary during December 17-24.
