This summer as the Leadership met for a weekend retreat at Sacred Heart, each Dean was encouraged to discern their need for a sabbatical from leadership. The Hastings and Steinauer Deans will not be taking a sabbatical. However, it's important for each Oblate to understand that they have continued their service for many years without time away. Please keep them in your prayers and offer them support and encouragement.

Over the past several months I have discerned the need to take time away as Lead Dean for the Nebraska Chapters. I have greatly enjoyed my service to this group in the capacity as Dean since 2012 and as Lead Dean for the past 5 years. It's time for me to step back from my duties and I will begin a sabbatical starting after the Oblation Ceremony next month, for 1 year. Lincoln Dean Jim Rea will be the Lead Dean until I return next fall.

One of the options that was given to a Dean taking a sabbatical is to share, as they desire, their plan for their time away from leadership. I'd like to share that with you now. A growing area of personal interest is to explore in greater depth, the human body as a connection to the Divine, a kind of "Physio Divina", through the spiritual practice called BioSpiritual Focusing. This fall I've been attending a series of classes led by two spiritual directors to further my knowledge and experience in this practice. I will continue to take time to cultivate the wisdom and perhaps share my knowledge with the Oblates after I return. Interestingly, this connection to the body is also something I'm working on as a Physical Therapist and will be teaching a class soon at Madonna Rehabilitation Hospital on this topic. There is growing research in PT regarding this connection to the body that they have found can help persons with different illnesses and overall stress reduction. I'm intrigued by this intersection of the human workings of the body and of the workings of the Divine.

The other area that I am going to plan more time to do is Lectio Divina. It's an area that in the past few years I have not given myself time enough to do. I plan on continuing to attend the Chapter Gatherings and my Cell group, which means more

time to prepare for the discussions and letting go of the need to worry about preparations, including coordinating the gatherings. I ask for your prayers during this time away from my leadership duties, and I'm looking forward to continue being part of this community! Thank you! Carol Olson, Lincoln Dean

Day 01: Sunday, June 16: Departure from United States to Frankfurt Airport via scheduled airline.

Afterwards we will drive via Ulm and Augsburg, both of which we will visit, on our way to St. Ottilien. Tonight will be our first night's stay in the Abbey. BD



Day 05: Thursday, June 20: Ettal, Wieskirche,

Oberammergau & Tutzing: After our breakfast, we will drive towards the Alps for a visit of the Abbey of Ettal, where we will have Mass. After a lunchbreak in Oberammergau, we will travel to the very beautiful Wieskirche, the masterpiece of the great churchbuilder Dominikus Zimmerman. In the afternoon we will continue to Tutzing at Stamberg Lake, to visit the Benedictine Sisters' monastery. We will join the sisters for an evening meal and return to St. Ottilien for overnight. BD

Day 06: Friday, June 21: Garmisch - Innsbruck -

St. Johann: This morning we will leave St. Ottilien and start our journey to Austria. First we will enjoy a visit to the very picturesque town of Garmisch. Then we will enter the Austrian Tyrol and see the Olympic city of Innsbruck, then this afternoon we will continue further east and stay in St. Johann at the Hotel Sport Austria. BD

Day 07: Saturday, June 22: Salzburg: After a short ride in our deluxe motorcoach, we will reach the city of Salzburg, where we will first visit St. Peter's Abbey for Mass. After a short walking tour through the Oldtown, we will enjoy lunch in the "Peterskeller"! There will be some free time before we leave Salzburg

After a morning visit to Heidelberg's famous castle, we will enjoy the view over the entire town. Then we will drive to Mainz to visit another one of the Imperial cathedrals. Later, we will have Mass in Mainz. Our day will end in the famous wine-town of Rüdesheim, where we will be staying overnight. BD

Day 14: Saturday, June 29; St. Hildegard -

Rüdesheim - Koblenz - Neuss This morning we will visit Hildegard von Bingens Abbey, high over the Rhine River valley. After church, we will go back into the valley to enjoy a boat trip along the Rhine River to St. Goar. The banks along the river are studded with castles and ruins. We will also pass by the famous Loreley rock on our way. Then we will reboard our motorcoach and continue on via Bonn, to the town of Neuss for our final two nights in Germany.

Day 15: Sunday, June 30; Neuss - Cologne- Düsseldorf

On our final day in Germany, we will visit the special city of Cologne. After Mass, we will enjoy a tour of the Cologne cathedral. On the way back to



Neuss, we will also stop in Düsseldorf for a stroll along Ko, the famous promenade, which is Düsseldorf's longest shopping street! This evening we will enjoy a farewell dinner together in a local brewery in Neuss! Overnight in Neuss hotel. BD
