A WORD FROM ST. BENEDICT'S RULE

Anyone who knocks at the door of the community should be welcomed as Christ, for he himself will say: I was a stranger and you welcomed me (Matthew 25:35c). We ought to honor the image of God in everyone, especially those who share our faith (Galatians 6:10) and in pilgrims. Once a guest's arrival has been announced, everyone should come out to greet them warmly. First, they should pray together and be united in peace; prayer should always precede a warm embrace because love is easily twisted and misunderstood. Humility should always be demonstrated toward a guest upon their arrival and departure. With bowed heads--or even on their knees--community member should adore Christ in the guests they welcome.


