Dear Oblates,

"Fall is proof that change can be beautiful." Father Kramper quoted this saying at Mass on Tuesday of last week. The colors on the trees are exceptionally beautiful in all their glory this fall. I hope you have had some time to enjoy all the beauties in nature before the snow came. However, the snow has a beauty of its own.

During the past month from September 30 to October 29, the **16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops** met in Rome. It was an unprecedented experience, for the first, at Pope Francis' invitation, men and women were invited, in virtue of their baptism to take part in the discussions and in the voting process of the Assembly of the Synod of Bishops.

The main themes throughout the Synod were communion, participation, and mission. Those present proposed a larger role for the laity in the Church. Reflecting how the nature or culture of the Church can be more synodal-a wiser listening to the Holy Spirit speaking through all peoples.

Pope Francis said on October 17, 2015, "The world in which we live, and which we are called to love and serve, even with its contractions, demands that the Church strengthen cooperation in all areas of her mission. God expects this path of synodality precisely of the Church of the third millennium."

The Synod will meet again in the fall of 2024 to continue the theme begun this year. Continue to pray for the success of it.

Before the next newsletter we will celebrate **Thanksgiving**, a time to be grateful for all our blessings; **Advent**, a special time to prepare for the birth of our Savior, and the beautiful feast of **Christmas**. May the spirit of Benedict be with you!

SHORTER CHRISTIAN PRAYER INSTRUCTIONS

Advent marks the beginning of the Liturgical Year. Sunday, December 3 is the first Sunday of Advent. We begin with <u>Evening Prayer 1</u> on Saturday night, Dec. 2, page 37. We are in Week I of the Shorter Christian Prayer. At the Reading turn to page 356. Follow the <u>Psalter Week I–IV</u> and at the Reading during weekdays turn to pages 362-378. These are repeated each week during Advent. Advent extends from December 3 through 24, 2023. Christmas Time extends from December 25 until January 9, 2024.

O ANTIPHONS

The final eight days of Advent are accentuated by the "O" statements that lead to the eight days of the Christmas octave. They are called the **O Antiphons** because they each begin with the letter O and address Jesus with a traditional title primarily from the prophecies of Isaiah and Micah. The O Antiphons may be read at Evening Prayer, December 17– 23rd, before the Canticle of Mary. The O Antiphons end December 23 because evening prayer on December 24 is the beginning of the Christmas vigil.
